After putting Angie and the kids on the plane to Tulsa, I'm flying to Kansas City to pick up my sister and brother-in-law's BBT (Big Black Truck) and then drive it down to Joplin to meet up with the rest of the family. For the second year in a row, the Uni-President Lions were crowned CPBL champions. Starting pitcher Luther Hackman threw a dominating four-hit complete game shutout, stifling a hapless Brother Elephants lineup 4-0 in last night's decisive game seven in Tainan. The 6'4 right-hander won two key games during the series, throwing 17 consecutive scoreless innings between game four and game seven. The former major leaguer simply took over the rubber match, blanking the Elephants on 112 pitches, striking out four and walking two. Hackman overpowered the Elephants with 145kph-plus fastballs, kneebending curveballs and changeups, taking advantage of an often impatient Elephants offense desperate to manufacture runs. With the victory, the Lions will go to Japan to face South Korean champions SK Wyvrens and the winner of the Japan series in the Konami Cup.
